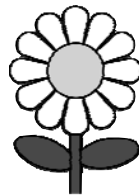

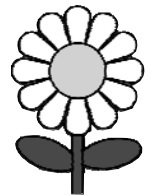

A cherub of a child, walking with the gusto of one who has just figured out how to coordinate her little legs, left the Pantry hugging her chocolate Easter Bunny box like it was a priceless treasure.

In March, the Outreach Pantry distributed 216 bags of groceries to 54 households, this total consisting of 161 individuals of all ages and ethnicities.
